

MINISTER'S LETTER

Dear friends:

One of the symbols of Easter is the butterfly. A series of books produced by The United Church has the title: <u>Prayers for an Easter People</u>. I am sure I am not alone in the hope this will be our year of Easter – escaping from the COVID19 cocoon which has imprisoned us at times and definitely has discouraged any level of physical contact among close friends and even family members. That is my prayer for 2023.

We have a great deal to celebrate as the result of 2022. The congregations of Emmanuel, Melrose and St. Mark's, Cannifton have spent a lot of time praying and negotiating the future of the Melrose Congregation. The leaders of all three congregations worked diligently at making the Melrose choice to close their congregational building to amalgamate with Emmanuel. Our hearts go out to these folks as they make the transition to adopt Emmanuel, Foxboro as their official House of Worship.

We express thanks to Beverly Dafoe and Deb Brown for their efforts to produce a new photo directory which includes folks from our entire congregation as it is currently constituted.

COVID19 has had a massive impact on the operation of our congregational business – in both the physical and the spiritual aspects of our ministry. During 2022 we held as many Board and congregational meetings as we could in order to address any pressing business coming our way. The most pressing business was to communicate, as far as we were able; the current status of the process of amalgamation with Melrose United Church.

Community outreach projects which include such activities as church sponsored in-house meals have had to be changed to drive-throughs. Our thanks to all who have organized these meals and made them such a smooth-running success. A biproduct of such meals is the experience they have made life less stressful for both the preparers and the servers. I am sure those in vehicles lined up along Yorke Drive while waiting for their meals felt less stress as they did not have to fear too close contact during the various times when COVID19 was spiking.

As you delve more deeply into this Report for 2022, you will note how many of our worshipping community we have lost over the past year. As Chair of the Board, I am most pleased to say our polity structure which includes the Session, Stewards, and Trustees has worked as well as possible during the past year. Regretfully, we received the news of Carol Watson's retirement from the position of Clerk of Session. Our Session continues to seek out new faces to sit at meetings and consult with the resident clergy in the conduct of regular and special services of worship. The Committee of Stewards and our Board of Trustees have both remained very much intact in the conduct of financial and physical structural aspects of caring for the needs or our congregation. It has been really remarkable to see our new arrivals from Melrose considering and taking positions in the operations side of our community of faith.

On a more personal note, I cannot express well-enough as to how truly blessed and thankful I am to be associated with Emmanuel United Church, Foxboro. The Sunday school program at Emmanuel welcomed new teachers, Sarah Bassett & Beth Pitt and Assistant teacher Neillia Bassett in October. Unfortunately, attendance from the children was sporadic, with the threat of COVID causing the parents to keep their children home if their children had any symptoms of COVID to protect the rest of the congregation.

The Sunday school sponsored a little boy from Nicaragua, Vicente Gabriel Nolasco Vilchez and sent him monetary support through Children Believe. Early in 2022, we were notified by Children Believe that Vicente was no longer enrolled in the sponsorship program. Hopefully it's because his family is now financially secure and Vicente no longer needed our assistance.

We were given another child to sponsor – Liam Jesus Cruz Flores, 10 months old from Nicaragua. Liam lives with his mother & father. His father is a casual labourer but his income is unstable and far from adequate to provide for basic needs. Our sponsorship assures that Liam and his family will receive proper medical assistance, clean water, education and skills-training programs.

In March, Children Believe sent us a letter, telling us that our monthly sponsorship rate would increase by \$5 per month, increasing our quarterly payments to \$132.00. Through generous donations from our congregation to the Sunday School account, we were able to continue our support of Liam. The Session & UCW's mandates are to support the Sunday school children and aid them financially if there is not enough money to make our quarterly commitment.

East Central Ontario Regional Council - 2022 Lay Rep Annual Report

The East Central Regional Council, one of 16 regions across Canada, stretches from Oshawa to Brockville and north past Peterborough and Lindsay. This year we have faced the challenge of the loss of our pastoral relations minister, Rev David Timpson, to illness and a recent change in Executive Minister upon the retirement of Rosemary Lambie.

As a region of East Central Ontario United Churches, we have been meeting twice a year online during the pandemic. I attended the 2022 spring online meeting where various forums present programs and report on their year's activities. This is most interesting as by working together with other churches across Eastern Ontario, we respond to Christ's call to followers. Anyone can subscribe to the weekly ECORC newsletter and find out what we are doing as a region of Christian churches. We can also post news about our own events and find out what is happening in other churches. There are many different items each week. Examples from the last newsletter:

- A Long Term Care Network
- The Dixie Shilling memorial Student Bursary
- Guaranteed Livable Income podcast
- Rural Connect (networking by rural churches in our Region)
- Children Youth and Young Adult leaders' newsletter

Other than coordinating the Prayer Shawl ministry for the Region (gathering shawls from across the region and/or preparing shawls for presentation to new and retiring ministers and Regional staff), I have not been active on any of the forums this year; but from past experience can attest that being a lay rep and/or working with a forum or workgroup are most inspiring and spiritually fulfilling. Communities of faith with over 100 members are eligible to elect two lay reps, and is a great way to see part of what it means to be a member of The United Church of Canada.

You can be involved without being elected to a position. Many events are open to all; and any member of any Community of Faith can either be (1) elected to a Ministry team Faith, Nurture and Justice; Covenant Support; Equity; Ministry Through Property) or (2) just join in for long or short-term work on a specific area of interest with a network or forum. Each Ministry Team is linked to Forums open to all. For example, the Formation, Nurture and Justice Team has 11 elected members with links to open Forums: Anti-Racism; Children/Young Adults First Third Ministry; Fair Trade; Truth & Reconciliation/Indigenous Justice and Right Relations; Guaranteed Living Income (e.g., Trenton United Warming Centre). Many churches are moving toward becoming community centres sharing space with other faith groups or community agencies; it is interesting to hear of their experiences.

This year we held our fall regional meeting in person. I was not able to attend but did read the reports and follow-up information. Through ECORC, various grants are possible. For example, St Mark's in Cannifton received a grant to host a hub which serves the area, for example, giving rural churches a way to meet in their own church and join on line for Sunday worship at times when they don't have a minister available. St Matthew's in Belleville received a grant to support their weekly Food Ministry.

There is always something to see, learn or do in service to our church. Am happy to assist anyone in the Emmanuel Community of Faith interested in connecting with the East Central Ontario Regional Council to which we belong.

2022 Annual Report

We worked closely with the Stewards on the items the Trustees were involved with. We met on Wednesday, November 2 everyone was in attendance.

Jim gave a report on the status of the front door repair, and its cost of \$9767.72. Even though it was getting late in the year, the hope was that it was going to be completed by year end.

We've been contacted by Mallory Fire Systems and informed they are getting back into the inspection side of the business and it was decided to give them a try for 2023.

Each Trustee was asked their intentions for 2023. Ivan and Ralph expressed their wish to retire as a Trustee. Everyone else was going to remain on the Committee. We thanked Ivan and Ralph for their involvement over the years.

Insurance – The main item on the agenda was the Trustee budget figure for 2023. After explaining input I had from the insurance company and the news of insurance being offered by the United Church of Canada, it was decided to stay with John Harvey and Desjardin Insurance. The budget figure was decided at \$4000.00.

Monthly inspections- These have been on a reduced schedule during COVID, but now we are getting back to normal.

Drinking water – The drinking water continues to be monitored. Water tests were done in February, April, & November. The test results were all good. Jim Stewart, Beverly and Steve Dafoe are Certified Drinking Water Systems Operators.

Building issues for 2022- We had no major building issues this year. Other minor repairs and upkeep are constantly ongoing.

MINISTRY AND PERSONNEL

2022Annual Report

The M & P Committee for 2022 was made up Stan Dafoe, Lori Gatward, and Jim Stewart. The position of Chair was filled by Jim. Jim also reported to the Official Board. We met once during the year on, October 26 to discuss the budget for 2023 and to deal with any other issues.

2023 Budget – The budget and actual figures for 2022 were reviewed and a proposed budget for 2023 was completed for presenting to the Official Board at the November meeting. The 2023 budget figure is \$87379 compared to 2022's budget of \$86704. This represents a \$675 increase from last year and covers a cost-of-living increase of 3.4 % suggested by the United Church, the difference in cost for an organist and a recommended increase for Beverly.

Beverly Dafoe - continues to do a good job as the Office Administrator, and has increased her rate to the amount given her last year. Her work load has returned to near normal pre-covid levels and the Church gets back to normal use. Her invoices have been very minimal and way under budget. Beverly was added as an ADP contact person last year.

Rev. Bob – The M & P Committee had a working breakfast at Heather's, we had an opportunity to talk about thing in a very relaxed forum. He is not looking at retirement at this time and quite happy with the support he has from the congregation and committees. He has said he would give us warning if circumstances were to change. It was pointed out that we should be mind full of his health and that of his family members and be prepared to cover for him if the need arises.

Minister of Music – The music arrangement with Michael is working quite well. He has been plying two Sundays a month and agreed to Anniversary Sunday and Christmas Eve service. Michael has told Beverly he is available for more Sundays. We have provided enough in the budget to cover several scenarios.

.The Committee thanks Rev. Bob, Beverly and all, for their contributions to a very unusual year at Emmanuel United Church.

COMMITTEE OF STEWARDS REPORT

This year was another very interesting year. The coronavirus (covid 19) closed our church in January and we amalgamated with Melrose United Church. This made a large difference in our income. When Melrose U.C. sold their property and church, we received \$180,085.47 from the sale. (We can only use 5% of this per year for operating expenses.) We have invested this money in GIC's for now. It costs about \$12,000 a month to keep the church operating. The offerings have covered almost half of the money required in past years. This year the government stepped in with a wage subsidy of \$9838.08 to help us out during the pandemic. Each year our budget shows a short fall. (The use of \$48,372 from investments was budgeted to cover this in 2022.) However, we used only \$1466.82 of these investments to help cover our costs, thanks, mostly, to UCW fundraising of \$27,250, government assistance and Melrose members joining us.

There is a "Bequest Plaque" that hangs at the back of the sanctuary. This plaque lists names of past members and their spouses who have left money to the church in their wills. We would like to encourage members to do this, and to become PAR donors also, to help offset bills that occur during the pandemic and holidays. (This is a monthly donation that comes directly from your bank account.)

In 2022, the only large expense was the re-furbishing of the front doors of the sanctuary. We saved money because the custodian and secretary reduced their hours for most of the year due to inactivity at the church due to covid.

The Stewards would like to particularly thank the United Church Women who continued to do fund-raising in our church. We would like to extend extra thankyous to Cheryl Mound, Bev Stewart and Beverly Dafoe. We would also like to thank Jim Stewart for the countless hours he puts in on our church finances and subsidies. We would also like to take this time to thank Ed Pallo for up-dating our website and to Steve Dafoe for all his custodial duties. Lastly, we thank our own committee members. They are Jim Stewart (church treasurer), Cheryl Pallo (envelope steward), Carolyn Dafoe (chair), Steve Dafoe, Brian Anderson, Donna Kennedy (secretary), Colleen Murray, Janis Bradshaw-Ethier and Murney Bradshaw for their decision making and maintenance. We are very happy to welcome Bill McFarlane to our committee this year.

As always, we look forward in the years ahead to continued stewardship and service for the life and work of Emmanuel United Church.

ENVELOPE STEWARD

The year 2022 saw total Sunday Offerings increase by \$7,935 from 2021. As Covid restrictions began to ease in late winter, we were able to have in-person worship more regularly as well as welcoming several new members to the congregation from our amalgamation with Melrose.

Of the 58 issued Envelope/PAR numbers in 2022, 52 contributed; up from 46 who contributed in 2021.

Of those 52 Envelope/Par contributors, the proportion shifted slightly in the categories of contributions.

To the Congregation of Emmanuel United Church

We conducted a review of the financial records of the Emmanuel United Church, both receipts and expenditures. This review acts as a double check on the records and ensures that all financial transactions have been properly recorded and the financial position of the Church has been properly reported. Our review of the finances involved comparison of ledger entries, bank statement entries, deposit slips and documentation of assets for the following (see next page for details of assets):

- General Account
- Emmanuel United Church Fund
- Mission & Service Fund

We reviewed the methods of counting and recording offerings and donations. Donations were reviewed only back to envelope numbers. The Envelope Steward prepares statements quarterly and receipts within a month of the end of the taxation year.

We reviewed the method of recording and receipting of Memorial donations. Our office administrator mails a receipt along with a letter of acknowledgement as soon as possible after donations are received.

Records of the treasurer were well organized, with clear annotations to explain entries. It was a straightforward process to compare invoices and computer ledger reports with monthly bank statements which include cancelled cheques.

In our opinion, the statement reviewed accurately reflects the financial position of Emmanuel United Church as of December 31, 2022

We would like to acknowledge the major contribution of time and service of all persons involved in the financial matters pertaining to Emmanuel United Church. Thank you to all for your assistance in preparation of material for us.

Prayer Shawl Ministry: 2022 Annual Report

Emmanuel UC carries out a Prayer Shawl Ministry. "Shawls" are given at times of celebration, life change or need for support, to send a message of God's love. They are meant for anyone in our church family or wider community; e.g., people moving away, coming into our community, entering nursing homes, facing medical challenges, grieving, heading to college, giving birth, getting married, starting a new job, graduating.

They come in many forms: shawls, scarves, lap rugs, stoles, baby blankets...all sizes, shapes and styles for young and old, male or female. Pocket prayer shawls (a few inches square), are for people to keep nearby as reminders of God's love and our friendship. For baptisms, we create a small crocheted square with the pattern of a cross.

Shawls are blessed during a Sunday Worship service and the following message is attached to the shawl: Prayer of Blessing - May God's grace be upon this shawl... warming, comforting, enfolding and embracing. May the one who receives this shawl be wrapped in love. Amen.

We thank Ann Casselman, Donna Kennedy, Cheryl Mound and Marion Coulter for creating shawls. Since we started in the Spring of 2018, we have given about 90 shawls. In 2022, we gave about one shawl a month. Another example of Emmanuel's mission to "support our Church, Community, Country and World through worship, music and sharing of gifts.
